**By the Numbers—Alabama's Response To Winter Storm**

**Clanton**—As the State of Alabama continues to thaw out from the worst winter storm in twenty years, here is a breakdown of resources mobilized to assist residents in the affected communities.

- There are **5** casualties attributed to the storm
- There are **54** injuries attributed to the storm
- There are **1180** state employees (peak **2142**) to include the Alabama National Guard mobilized.
- The Alabama Department of Education reports all remaining students and faculty at schools requesting assistance have been transported home
- The Alabama National Guard is utilizing up to **9** heavy duty wreckers to move stranded vehicles to the shoulder of the road
- There are **13** public safety and security agencies deployed providing four wheel drive assets and Trooper assistance
- There are **14** shelters open as of Wednesday night, serving **300** occupants
- There are Warming Stations in **8** counties
- There are **2377** customers without electricity
- The Emergency Operations Center remains activated at level **2**
